

3. The Power of Disinformation

3.1. Russia's Nuclear Propaganda

High media presence has not only become a threat to information but is now a powerful tool to fight with. Russia has been consistently using disinformation as a weapon against Ukraine. Russia continues to manipulate political narratives, use propaganda, and disinformation to weaken Ukraine's reputation and mitigate its attention in the media, giving Russia the upper hand.⁷ Russia has been producing an overwhelming amount of disinformation to the public by creating artificial and fake government websites specifically denying sanctions, military aid, the front lines, and refugees. Unfortunately, this crime has been going on undetected. Due to the sheer volume of disinformation, it is difficult to track,
